Diocesan Endowment Campaign Faith to Move Mountains

St. Catharine-St. Margaret Parish has accepted to be amongst the 20 parishes of the Diocese that will pioneer this campaign. The goal and the vision of Bishop O'Connell is to create an endowment fund that will secure the resources that will be needed through the next generation for the parishes, schools, priestly ministry, religious education and social services of the Diocese. This effort should not be mistaken for the Bishop's Annual Appeal which is used to maintain the day to day operations of the Diocese. The mission of the campaign is to provide endowments, whose proceeds will be used to address long term and extraordinary needs of the diocese.

Each Catholic family/individual in the diocese will be asked to be a part of this campaign.

A group of parishioners have formed a committee here in our parish, to assist and work with me in this project. I am grateful for their leadership and dedication on behalf of our parish. If you hear from one of these volunteers, please meet with them, kindly listen to what they have to say, and prayerfully consider supporting this vital undertaking.

It should be noted that 30% of funds raised here will revert back to the parish to be used for our many needs here.

Over the next weeks, you will be hearing more about the campaign as we seek to invite everyone to participate in this extraordinary effort.

Dear Parishioners...

"No prophet is accepted in his own country" These are words that we heard from the lips of Jesus in the gospel reading on Sunday, July 5. An obvious reason for this is, of course, because a prophet has a way of saying things that are not popular or politically correct. We are very comfortable with prophets, as long as they live in the Old Testament or somewhere far away from where we live. Prophets always have a way of challenging and upsetting some people, and enraging others.

By these standards Pope Francis is a prophet for our times. He has a way of upsetting and challenging people's assumptions and beliefs almost whenever he speaks. We saw this very forcibly with his encyclical on the environment earlier this month. Even in church circles I heard it said that on the occasion of his spiritual retreat, that there was a sigh of relief that at least for a week or ten days, he would not be saying anything controversial.

And now, we are gearing up for the visit of this prophet to our country in September. People who are invested in the status quo are understandably concerned. Political leaders who are satisfied with political, economic and ecclesial business as usual may not be ready for what he has to say.

John Boehner and Nancy Pelosi, very different Catholics, have invited him to address Congress. Many people remember that it was not that long ago when many American leaders were strong in their belief that a Catholic should never be the President of this country because he would be taking his orders from the Pope. Now Jorge Bergoglio has been invited to address and presumably offer prophetic guidance to that same legislative body.

If he is true to form, there will be many uncomfortable members of Congress, and many of them will be Catholics. One has to speculate if the Pope will use the occasion to repeat his indictment of the politics and the **"economy of exclusion"** and **"trickle down economics"** that he has expressed on many occasions. Will he make some on the right uncomfortable with a criticism of anti-immigrant policies? And on the other side of the aisle there will be some who will be uncomfortable with his criticism of a **"throw-away"** society that threatens unborn children and others.

Perhaps he will reiterate what he has said on another occasion: **"It is not 'progressive' to try to resolve problems by eliminating a human life"**.

Whether he says it or not, one thing is sure, he will bring with him the conviction that he is sure to articulate in one way or another: **"the greatness of a society is found in the way it treats those most in need, those who have nothing apart from their poverty."** That is a thought that all of us, leaders and followers can embrace.

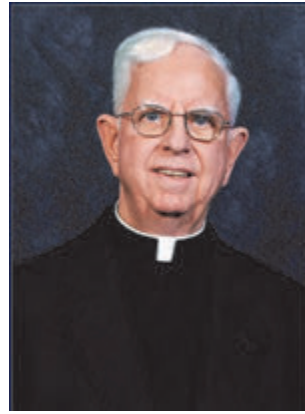
